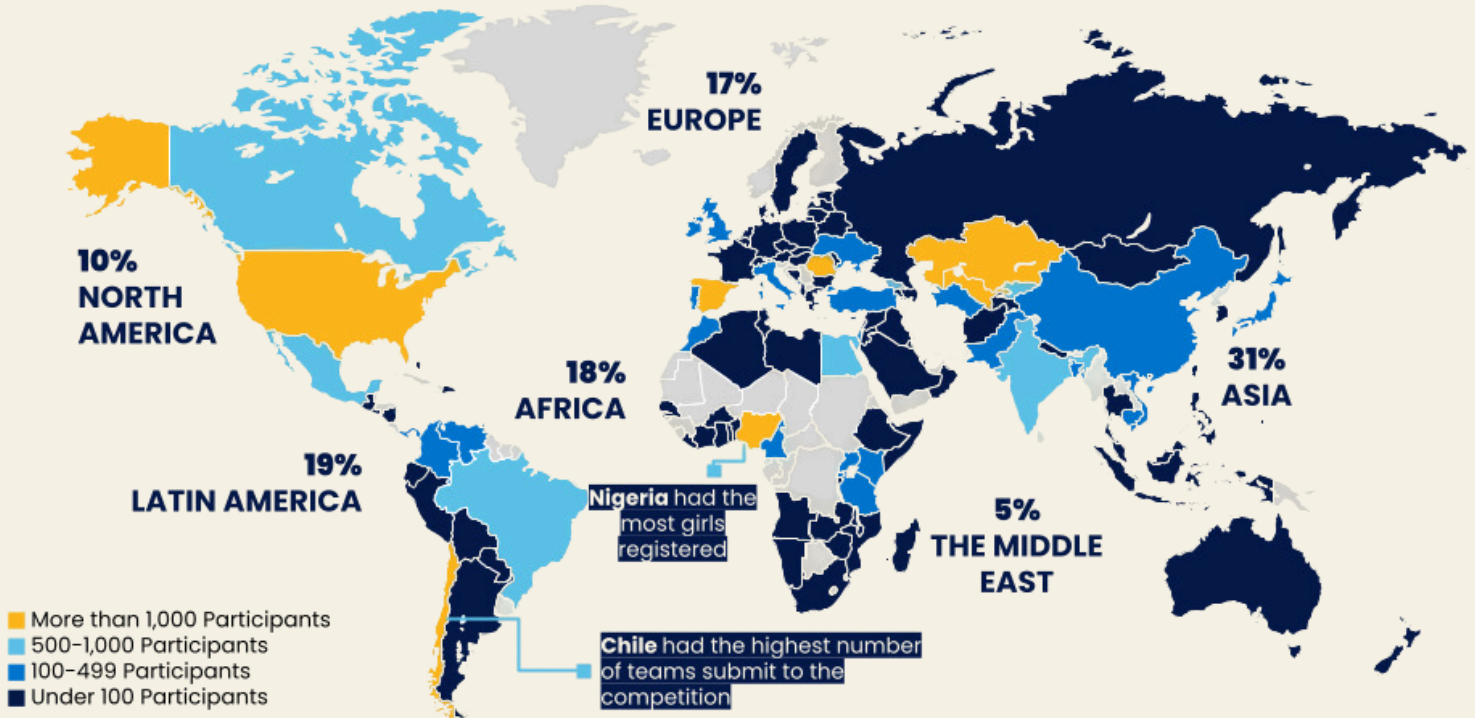

An integral part of girls' learning journey and Technovation's mission

A key component of the success of our program is the volunteers, like you, who share their time and expertise with the girls. The work you put into creating a positive learning environment gives girls the opportunity to grow as leaders and build their sense of belonging in STEM.

Ambassadors – Chapter, Club and Student build a sense of local community within the program, helping girls find peers and role models with interests similar to their own.

Girls get direct support from **Mentors** and **Coaches** to apply what they are learning to solve a problem that is important to them in their community with technology.

Judges review completed projects sharing encouragement and ideas of how students can grow their projects.

Once they have completed a season, the girls, now alumnae, carry on to champion change in our world. Some return to the program as volunteers, others join the **Alumnae Leadership Board** or are **guest speakers** at high profile events, showcasing the importance and impact of their voice.

Through research and our 17 years of experience, Technovation has seen the great difference that community and support from volunteers have on the girls in the program. This report is further evidence of the immense impact that you as a volunteer have and a testament to your commitment.

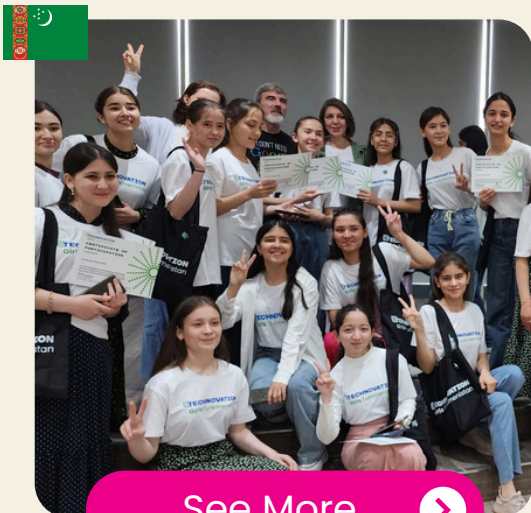

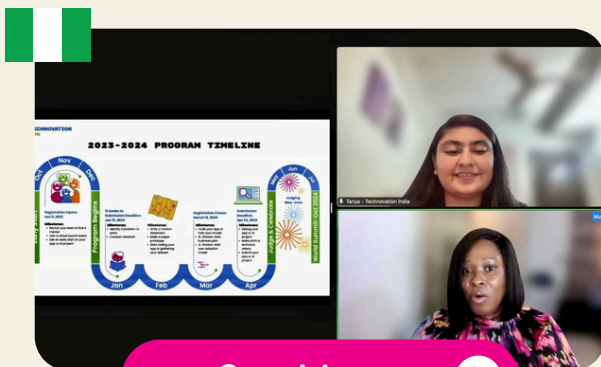

CHAPTER AMBASSADOR

Chapters are led by organizations, with a designated leader called a Chapter Ambassador. They run the Technovation program on a larger scale often through a “train the trainer” model. They are led by an individual or team affiliated with an organization with previous experience in program implementation.

CLUB AMBASSADOR

Clubs are led by individual volunteers called Club Ambassadors who run Technovation with girls in a community. Club Ambassadors can be parents, teachers, industry professionals, university students, or any involved community member. They coordinate programming by recruiting and supporting adult Mentors to work with multiple student teams.

MENTORS

92.5% of teams that submitted a project to the 2024 season had a Mentor

Mentors support one or more teams through the program as they learn about coding, AI, and real-world problem solving. Working with the team, Mentors provide project management support to help keep students motivated and on track for the submission deadline. Where possible, mentors also connect them to additional resources to enhance their learning.

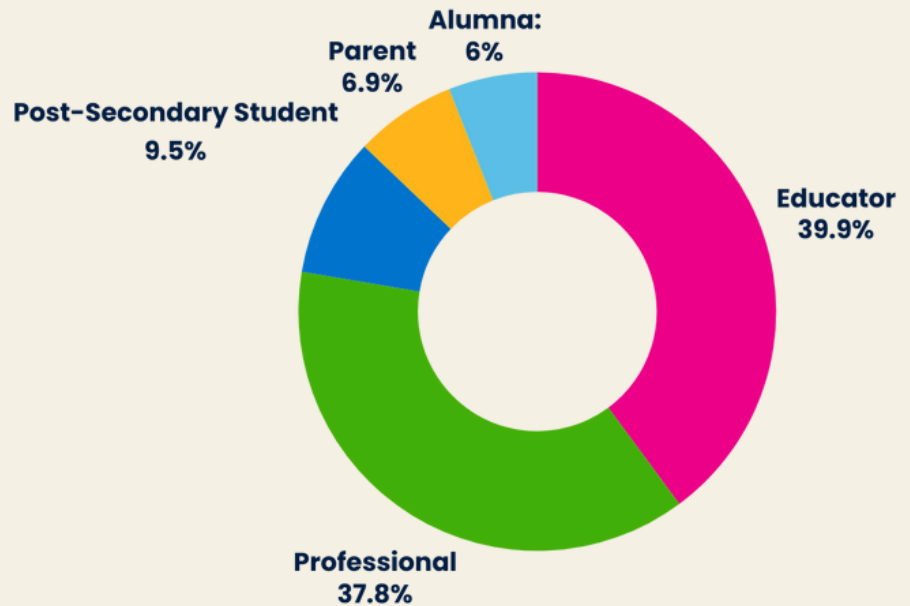

NEW Video Content

In 2024, we expanded the resources provided to Mentors with video resources, thanks to a grant from Vodafone.

COACHES

Introduced in the 2023 season, Coaches are topic specialists who meet with teams for 1 hour to answer questions and provide feedback. Students book time with Coaches in one of the program areas: ideation, coding, entrepreneurship, pitch, and video production. For safety, this volunteer role is exclusively available to Technovation corporate partners.

How Technovation Supports Coaches

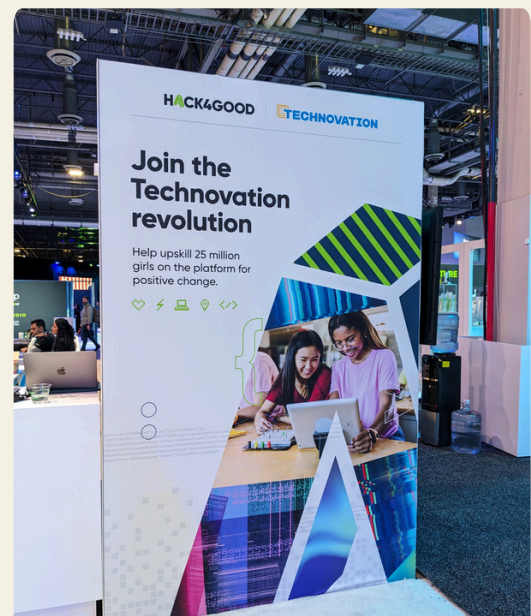

JUDGES

Judges provide numeric scores and written feedback to encourage teams to continue building their projects. This happens in person at local Regional Pitch Events or virtually. Judges are asked to review at least 5 submissions from our 3 divisions. Receiving scores and feedback from professionals is a critical pillar of the learning journey for Technovation participants.

Regional Pitch Events, or RPEs, allow the local community to celebrate the girls' learning and for girls to showcase their projects. It might also be the only time parents get to see what their daughters have been working on. Additionally, Regional Pitch Events serve as the first round of judging to determine which teams will move through to the semifinal round of judging.

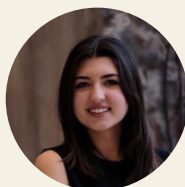

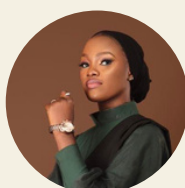
